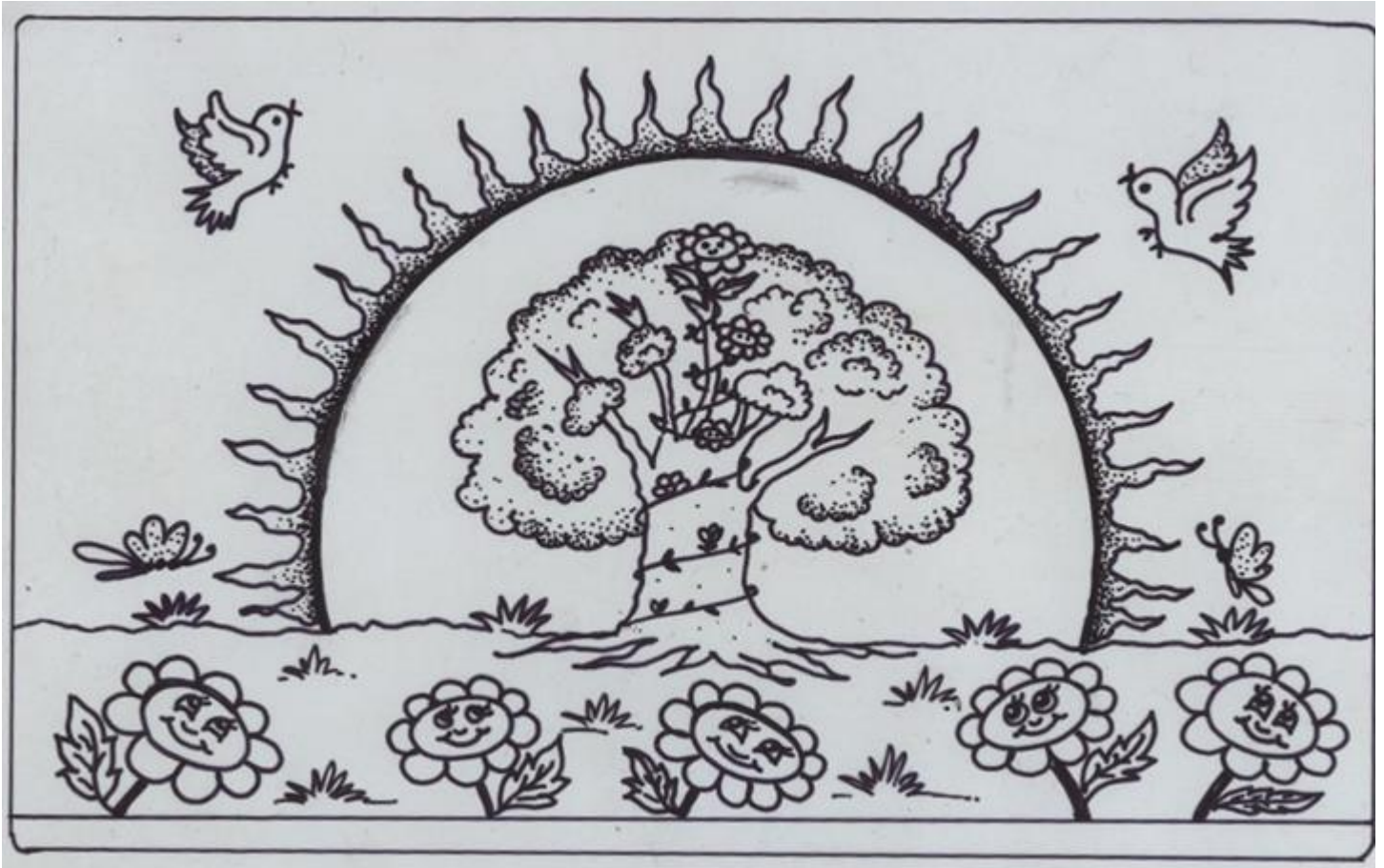

Day to day affairs of running the school are being managed by the Principal assisted by appropriate staff under overall supervision of the School Committee comprising of 3 or 4 representatives of the Trust, the Principal and a representative of the teaching and non-teaching staff. The School Building is spacious with all modern facilities and is designed to accommodate students from Grade.1 to Grade. 12 with a seating capacity of 7,200 students working in two shifts. The school does not receive any Grant – in – Aid from the Government and the only source of income is the amount of fees collected from the students.

Any constructive suggestion from the parents whose children are being admitted to the school shall always be welcomed. The Trust Office is housed in the Yashodham High School Building, Goregaon (E), Mumbai – 400 063, where such constructive suggestions can be recorded with the Trustee – in – charge.

Parent-Teacher Association has been established on 16.12.1997 vide circular from School Education Department of Government of Maharashtra. Each parent shall be a member of the PTA.

SCHOOL INFORMATION

1. VASANT VIHAR HIGH SCHOOL & JUNIOR COLLEGE was founded on 02-07-1990. The medium of instruction in the School is English. Presently, the classes are conducted for Primary (Grade. 1 to Grade. 4), Secondary (Grade 5 to Grade. 10) and Junior College (Grade 11 and Grade 12). The Institution is recognized on permanently unaided basis.
2. The School follows CISCE Curriculum. The school prepares students of Grade 1 to 12 for Indian Certificate of Secondary Education (ICSE) / Indian School Certificate (ISC) conducted by (CISCE).
3. The academic year of the school begins in March.
4. The School has well-equipped Libraries, Science Laboratories, Auditorium, Computer Laboratories and digital smart boards in classrooms
5. Physical training and outdoor games are compulsory (unless a doctor's certificate is produced)
6. Admissions of children to the school is open to all, irrespective of caste, creed, religion and sex.
7. Should the Parent / Guardian feel that his / her child is not making the desired progress, the principal should be contacted for guidance. OUR TEACHERS ARE NOT PERMITTED TO OFFER PRIVATE TUITIONS. The Parents are advised to refrain from engaging teachers either from the school or from outside for coaching, as such tuitions normally do more harm than good.
8. The school premises are under CCTV surveillance.

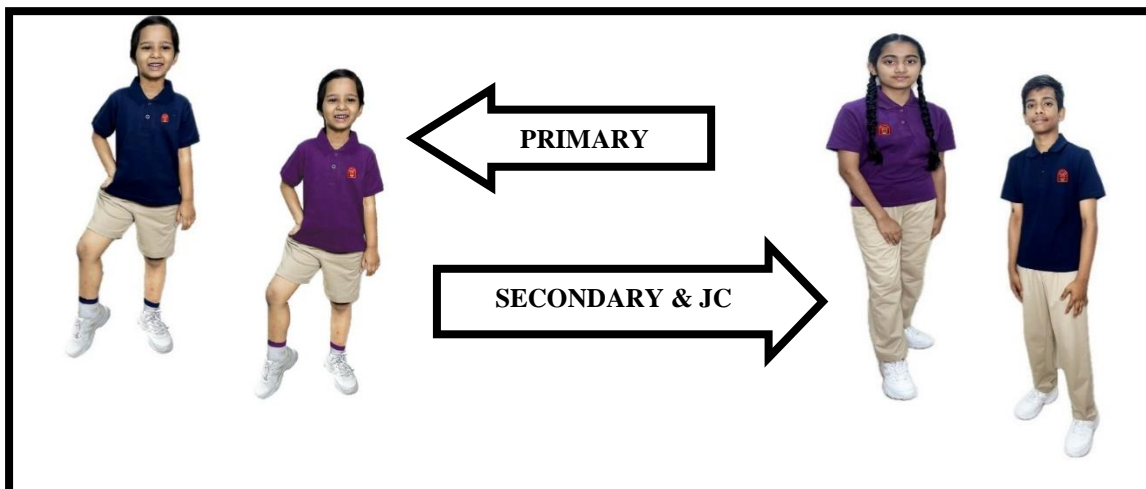
ADMISSIONS / WITHDRAWALS

1. Parents seeking admission for their ward in Grade 1 will have to produce any one of the following documents to confirm the date of birth.
 - a. Birth certificate given by hospital / municipality.
 - b. School leaving certificate from the Pre Primary school.
 - c. Affidavit filed by the parent.
2. For seeking admission the parent / guardian will have to fill the admission form online and attach scanned copies of necessary documents not exceeding the size as per the format given in the admission notification published on the school website.
3. At the time of admission to the School, the age limit prescribed by the State Government shall be rigidly adhered to. No relaxation in age will be given. For Grade. I admission, the age criteria will be as per the directives of the Education Department.
4. On being granted admission, the parent / guardian will have to fill in the online Admission Form and submit the necessary certificates in original for verification.
5. A child coming from a recognized school will be admitted only when a School Leaving Certificate from the school he / she has last attended, is produced. The School Leaving Certificate or Transfer Certificate should bear the recognition number of that school, Saral Id No. of the student and UDISE No. (Primary / Secondary, as may be applicable).
6. All withdrawals from the school can be made only on the written request for the same giving one calendar month's notice or paying fees equivalent to one month in lieu of the notice period by the parent / guardian of the child to the Principal. Signatures of both the parents, is mandatory on the application.
7. In case of request for a duplicate of the school leaving certificate, the parent / guardian, will have to produce an affidavit stating therein what has happened to the original certificate and why a duplicate School Leaving Certificate is needed.
8. In case of adopted child, a certified copy of adoption document is to be submitted at the time of admission.
9. In all matters regarding admission, Principal's decision shall be final and binding on parents.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

Wearing clean and well ironed uniform is compulsory for students. Any student who comes to school without proper uniform or whose appearance is found untidy, is liable to be sent home.

Uniform and shoes other than the pattern recommended by the school will not be permitted.

- STUDENTS SHOULD NOT COME TO SCHOOL WEARING SLIPPERS NEITHER ON REGULAR DAYS NOR DURING MONSOONS.

NOTE

1. Incase of any foot injury, students should submit an application and a doctor's certificate and get prior permission from the Principal for wearing an appropriate footwear or for using the lift.
2. Any student who does not heed to the rules persistently with respect to uniform and dress code is liable to be sent home.
3. In order to reduce social conflict and peer pressure, the school has decided to make it mandatory for students to come to school in school uniform on all days including birthdays.

RULES REGARDING LEAVE, ABSENCE ETC.

1. Regular Attendance is essential.
2. Students must be present in the school after holidays / vacations on the re-opening day of the school. They must also remain present in the school on the last working day of the school, preceding the holidays / vacations. Such absence will be viewed seriously. School authorities must be informed immediately in case of any exigencies or emergencies.
3. A medical certificate will have to be produced immediately in case of absence due to sickness and while resuming school after sickness, a medical fitness certificate must be submitted by the student.
4. A student should not remain absent from the school except in case of emergency. On the day on which he / she returns to school, the student must produce a note in from his / her parent / guardian stating the reason for the absence. The School accepts no responsibility in case of failure in producing this note from the parent / guardian. The student is liable to be handed over to the parent / guardian for taking back home.
5. If the child is ill, suffering from some contagious disease, the Principal should be informed of the same within two days by the parent / guardian, supported by a medical certificate. The child should not be sent to school till he / she is free from any danger of carrying infection. At the time of resuming school, the child must produce a medical fitness certificate.
6. Any student who is late in attending school, should bring with him / her a written application from his / her parent / guardian for late attendance.
7. No student will be permitted to leave school early. No half day leave will be granted.
8. Attendance and wearing school Uniform at all official school functions, like, Independence day, Republic day , Sports day etc. is compulsory. Corrective measures will be taken against absentees.

Reporting late to school is not permitted.

RULES FOR THE STUDENTS

1. This is an English medium school. All the students are expected to speak in English.
2. The school uniform and identity card must be worn every day. A student without proper uniform will be sent back.
3. Uniform worn should be neat and tidy, hair properly combed and clean shoes.
4. Students should not wear jewellery, costly wrist watches and should not bring valuable items, mobile phones, I-Pads etc. to school.
5. Books not recommended, magazines, comics etc, should not be brought to the school. No article likely to be a source of disturbance should be brought to school. Use of Mobile Phones in the school premises is strictly prohibited. A fine of 2000/- will be levied if the mobile phone is confiscated.
6. Students are expected to arrive at school before the assembly bell. Habitual late comers will be sent home after three late marks.
7. Any student coming late will not enter the class unless he / she brings a note to the teacher from the Co-ordinator / Principal.
8. Students must maintain silence in the school. They must maintain discipline when moving from one class to another. They should move in a single line only.
9. No student will be excused from Physical Education without a Doctor's Certificate.
10. No collections will be made by the students unless permitted by the Principal in advance.
11. Students are not allowed to give presents to the teachers.
12. Students are not allowed to distribute sweets / presents / eatables of any kind on their birthday. Instead they can voluntarily donate a book/s to the school library, to inculcate the good habit of reading and sharing.
13. Students should take care of their books, clothes, pens, wrist watch, money, etc. School does not undertake any responsibility for loss of such things.
14. Students should be regular, courteous, well-behaved, disciplined and clean in their dress and habits.
15. A student who is persistently insubordinate, willfully mischievous, guilty of misconduct and/or has unwholesome influence on fellow students is liable to be expelled from the school.
16. A student is responsible to the school not only for his / her behaviour in the school but also for his / her general behaviour outside. Every effort should be made by the student to keep up the goodwill of the school by his / her manner and deportment. Students should greet their teachers / visitors when they meet them.
17. Students will not take part in any political activities.
18. During the absence of the teacher, the Prefect or Monitor will be responsible for the order and discipline of the class.
19. It is forbidden to buy eatables from street vendors.
20. Students are expected to KEEP THE SCHOOL PREMISES CLEAN.
21. All students are expected to :
 - show respect to all the teachers.
 - avoid shouting, whistling or running in the school building.
 - avoid using indecent language.
 - avoid throwing paper anywhere in and around the School premises, except in the bins provided for the purpose.
 - observe all the rules of good conduct in the buses and on the streets while coming to or returning from school.

CONDUCT OF STUDENTS IN THE SCHOOL BUS

(Rules to be followed for a safe ride)

1. Students should not carry any electronic communication device / gadget in the school bus.
2. Students should be seated before the bus moves. They shall not stand until the bus comes to a complete halt.
3. It is mandatory for the Students to wear the RFID card issued by the school.
4. They should be able to carry their belongings on and off the bus by themselves.
5. Reasonable silence must be maintained in the bus journey to ensure that the driver is not disturbed.
6. No bullying or unruly behaviour will be tolerated. The offender will not be allowed to use the bus after one warning.
7. No part of the student's body or any object belonging to students should protrude from the bus window or door.
8. Students should not litter the bus. Cleanliness has to be maintained.
9. Any willful damage to the bus should be reported to the Principal and the offender will be dealt with severely.
10. Students must obey and must be courteous to the bus-in-charge. Students found misbehaving in the bus will not be allowed to continue availing the bus facility.

INTERNET / CYBER SAFETY

Internet is an amazing source of information, is a way to stay connected with friends and family. However, it has a flipside and comes with its share of problems. Internet safety is about Students being smart about how to handle themselves online and protecting themselves from falling prey to any online scam.

STRATEGIES AT STUDENT LEVEL

Students should be encouraged to :

- ❖ take responsibility for managing their digital reputation.
- ❖ trust each other respectfully online and offline.
- ❖ understand the importance of protecting their password.
- ❖ think about where they are travelling to and whether it is a safe place to spend their online time.
- ❖ be aware that people can pretend to be anybody they want online, so it is best to have only offline friends.
- ❖ share their experience of cyber bullying with adults.

STRATEGIES AT THE PARENT / FAMILY LEVEL

- ❖ Place computers in a central location at home.
- ❖ Be active in their child's life and should know who their friends are, both online and offline.
- ❖ Look out for signs of bullying such as
 - a. Loss of interest in school.
 - b. Not wanting to spend time with friends.
 - c. Anxiety around technology uses.
 - d. Being depressed.
 - e. Difficulty in sleeping.
 - f. Lower school performance.
- ❖ Keep evidence of cyber bullying.
- ❖ Set up an alert on Google.
- ❖ Educate their child not to leave her / his mobile phone lying around where others can use it, without permission.

IMPORTANT NOTE

1. Display of any disorderly conduct, doing of any act which causes or likely to cause physical / or psychological harm, raise apprehension or fear or shame or embarrassment to a student in or outside the school, which includes abusing, threatening, or playing practical jokes or leaving and causing hurt to any student is strictly prohibited.
2. Asking any student to do or forcing him /her to do something which a student will not in the ordinary course willingly do, is also a punishable offence.
3. Any such disorderly act found by the Institution, will be subject to an enquiry by a Committee constituted by the school.
4. If students involved are found to be at fault, the same will be reported to the competent authorities for necessary action.
5. In addition such students are liable to be dismissed from the school. They may not be able to get admitted in any Educational Institution for a period of five years.

SAFETY MEASURES

1. Students should compulsorily wear the identity-card issued to them by the school along with their uniform.
2. Parents should always possess the identity card issued by the school when they enter the school premises.
3. Parents should inform the school authority regarding the particulars of the person they delegate to collect their Students from school, if they are not doing so themselves.
4. Students should be given the following instructions periodically and they should be alert at all times.
 - Students should not talk to strangers, accept anything in cash or kind from strangers.
 - Students should never agree to go home with strangers.
 - Students should not agree to go home even with a relative without prior confirmation from their parents.
 - Students should not talk loudly on streets or in front of strangers about any situation of their home or about the time when their parents are not at home.
 - Students should always move around in groups, especially to and from school.
5. It is imperative for parents to collect their Students from the point at which they are left by the school bus otherwise the Students will be brought back to school.
6. Parents should explain the concept of good touch and bad touch to their wards.
7. Parents can form car pool groups for safe transportation of Students.
8. Parents should supervise / stay with their wards when they go down to play.
9. Sending Students to shops / shopping centre, alone should be avoided.
10. Parents are advised not to send their wards to school if they are unwell.
11. Along with the values learnt in school, it is of utmost importance to lay stress on cleanliness, hygiene and above all a sense of responsibility.

RULES FOR THE SCHOOL LIBRARY

1. The Library is open from : Monday to Friday : 7.00 a.m. to 6.30 p.m.
 Saturday (1st, 3rd, 5th) : 9.00 a.m. to 3.00 p.m.
2. Books will be issued for the use of the BORROWER only.
4. A pupil can borrow or return books once a week only.
5. Books should not be kept for more than a week. At the end of each period the books may, if desired, be renewed at the discretion of the Librarian. However, for such a renewal, the book must be produced.
6. Failure to return a book on the expiry of the period of a week, the pupil will be penalized (Rs 5/- per day.)
7. Books must be kept clean and used carefully. No marking should be done in the Library book. Any imperfection found in them or any damage done to them must be reported to the School Librarian before taking the book home. The damage done to books or magazines and loss of books will have to be made good by the pupil concerned.
8. Reference books and magazines cannot be borrowed or taken out of the Library.
9. Students can borrow parallel text-books of ICSE / ISC syllabus.
10. All books must be returned in good condition before the beginning of each Terminal Examination and before a Leaving Certificate is issued. The borrower who fails to return a book must pay a fine equal to the value of the book.
11. No personal books, bags, satchels, electronic gadgets and eatables are allowed in the library. Any personal books found will be confiscated. Only writing sheets and a pencil may be taken in.
12. Every pupil should help to keep the Library clean and tidy and see that the books and magazines are kept in their proper places.
13. Strict silence must be observed in the Library and conversation should be kept to the minimum and sound should be low.
14. The Library should be used only for the peruse of reference books, parallel text books, periodicals and reviews.
15. Before taking the School Leaving Certificate / Hall Ticket every student is requested to return all Library books
16. Library will be closed on Public and National Holidays.

Pupils are requested to take special care of the Laboratory materials and apparatus. The cost of repairs and replacements if any will be borne by the pupils concerned. No pupil is allowed in the Laboratory except during Practical Periods.

It aims at developing a co-operative attitude through the organization and participation associated with music, dance and drama. It further aims at developing appropriate skills and knowledge with understanding, as a basis for further study or leisure or both...

In – house Sports Coaching

At GAET, Sports are given a place of prominence in conjunction with other co-curricular activities. We firmly believe that a healthy mind resides in a healthy body and hence encourage each and every child to participate in sports. Coaching facilities for Handball, Throwball, Basketball and Baseball are extended to all the students during school hours. Students learn different skills required to play these games and it also help them to increase their strength and stamina.

RECOMMENDATIONS TO PARENTS

1. Since this is an English medium school, every student should learn to speak and write good English. Hence at home, he / she should be given an opportunity to speak English and speak it correctly.
Parents should instruct their ward that, except for Hindi / Marathi classes, English alone should be spoken during the school hours.
2. Parents and Guardians are reminded that without their help and co-operation not much can be achieved by the efforts made by the school to mould and improve the character of the child. They are earnestly requested to instill discipline.
3. Parents are earnestly requested to sign any remarks made by the School Authorities and do the needful in the matter.
4. Parents should not engage school teachers as private tutors vide item 8 under School Information. We strongly discourage private tuitions. Instead, we would suggest that you inculcate in your ward the habits of self – study and regularity in study. Avoid all kinds of distractors like T.V. radio, video, Internet, etc. Let your child surf the net only for essential information under the parental supervision.
5. Parents are requested to refrain from giving any gifts to the members of the staff.

RULES REGARDING FEES

1. Fees for Grade 1, Grade 5, Grade 11 and Grade 12 to be paid annually.
2. Term Fees must be paid in June along with 1st quarter and 2nd Term fees along with 3rd quarter. Fees can be paid quarterly , Half -yearly or annually.
3. The delay of payment beyond 3 months renders a pupil liable to be struck off the roll. If the pupil is re-admitted the Admission Fee must be paid again.
4. If a student is to be withdrawn, one calendar month's notice should be given in writing by the Parent / Guardian to the Principal of the School in order to arrange for the refund of the balance of tuition fees. In exceptional circumstances of withdrawal, one month's tuition fee in lieu of one calendar month's notice will have to be paid. Amount collected as Term Fee or Tuition Fee will not be refunded.
5. Students whose fees are not paid will be considered as defaulters.
6. Unless all dues are paid by the student, the results of the examinations / tests conducted by the School will not be communicated to the student. School Leaving Certificate will not be issued till all the outstanding dues from the student at the time of leaving the school are paid and clearance certificate from the concerned authority is obtained.
7. Students who leave the School in the month previous to any vacation must pay the fees for the vacation.
8. No deduction in fees will be allowed for vacations or for broken period of the month. Full month's fee will be payable if the student's name appears on the roll on the 1st day of the month. Admission fee will not be refunded even if the student, for any reason, leaves the school immediately after securing admission.

FEES

School fees will be accepted only through Edusprint App.

Payment made from the 11th of the due month will be subject to a surcharge of ₹.200/- till the end of the month.

Thereafter a surcharge of ₹.400/- per month or part thereof shall be paid additionally.

BUS FACILITY

The School provides bus service to the students of the Primary Section and Secondary Section of VVHS & JC under the aegis of GAET.

INSTRUCTIONS :

- The bus facility is extended to students only when there is an availability of seat and is offered at the Principal's discretion. This offer can be withdrawn any time.
- Students will board and alight only at fixed bus stops. Parents and children are requested not to ask the driver or attendant to stop the buses at unauthorized bus stops.
- Parents are not permitted to change the bus stops without prior permission. In case there is a change in the bus stop, the parents must inform the school in writing.
- Children must obey and must be courteous to the bus – in – charge. Children found misbehaving in the bus will not be allowed to continue availing the bus facility.
- In the event of the child not being at the stop at scheduled time the bus will proceed without the child. It will be the responsibility of the parent/ guardian to drop the child to school. In the event of there being no one to receive the child at the stop of the return journey, the child will be brought to the school and the parents will have to collect their child from the school authorities on presentation of their identity card.
- If the parent doesn't want their ward to avail the bus facility for some reason on a particular day, the school must be informed about it in writing.
- In case of any grievance, parents must inform the school authorities in writing for appropriate action. Parents must not enter / board the school bus for any reason.

BUS FACILITY

IDENTITY CARD :

- Children using the bus facility need to wear an RFID Card issued by the school which must have the bus number written on it.
- In case there is a change in the residential address the school office must be notified immediately and a fresh RFID Card must be obtained.
- If the Bus RFID card is lost a written application requesting a duplicate RFID card must be submitted in the school office immediately. Collect the duplicate RFID Card from the school office by making a payment of Rs 50/- by cheque.

WITHDRAWAL :

- No Bus child will be permitted to go home without submitting the permission letter.
